

### NEWS FROM THE LENT SEASONAL TEAM

The Season of Lent

Can you believe it? The days are getting longer, talk of spring planting has begun. We anticipate the appearance of Punxsutawney Phil.

Most especially Lent begins with the distribution of Ashes on February 22. (This service is not at our church this year. More details will come to you as they are made available.)

When we come forward to receive these ashes, we are affirming that we are sorry for our sins and that we want to use the season of Lent to correct our faults, purify our hearts, control our desires and grow in holiness so we will be prepared to celebrate Easter with great joy."

Lent focuses the heart on repentance and prayer and culminates in the celebration of Easter.

This 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where Satan tempted him. Lent offers us believers a time for similar reflection, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection. In other words, the passion with which Christ lived and worked.

We invite all our brothers and sisters to join us as we "Reawaken Our Passion" during this time of reflection, and faith building.

We will delight in special music, and passion filled reflections and celebrate communion together each week. We are planning a weekly bible study series Mondays at 6:00 pm, based on the book "The Desert of Compassion" by Rachel M. Srubas. We encourage all to deepen your connection, and Reawaken your Passion with us as we journey from here to the cross.

At FPC it all begins Feb 26, the first Sunday of Lent and Feb 27 the first Monday bible study.

Stay tuned for more information as the season progresses to Holy week where FPC will host Good Friday service.
