Dear FPC family,

I hope this message finds you in the joy and light of Christ during this season of Epiphany. As a church, we have been celebrating this season during our Sunday worship services by reflecting on the theme "Come Light your Candle. Go Light your World." Before we move into the season of Lent next month, I want to impress upon you for one last time the significance of the Epiphany of Christ for each one of us. My hope is that every member of our church should have a personal epiphany of Christ and become the light of Christ in our community and area of influence.

The word 'Epiphany' means a sudden revelation or manifestation. It is like the 'Eureka' moment in our Christian faith where we get a sudden, personal, and profound realization of who Jesus Christ is. This personal revelation of Christ is not something reserved for a privileged few but is available for all. The lives of those who receive this epiphany will be transformed for the best, just as Saul was transformed from being a persecutor of the Church to a faithful proclaimer of Jesus Christ after the epiphany in the Road to Damascus. Though this blissful experience is available for all, there is a simple prerequisite, which is 'Earnest-curiosity'. In Matthew 2:1-12, we read about the wise men who traveled to Bethlehem from a far-away land in the East to see the Christ-child. In all likelihood, these men were non-Jews, and yet they had the epiphany of Christ. The reason is, those wise men who studied the stars and the planetary motion, perceived the appearance of the unique star as an indication of the birth of a king. Informed by their field of specialty, they developed an earnest-curiosity and took a long and arduous journey to confirm their hypothesis of the birth of a king. Though their quest was triggered by a scientific curiosity, their earnestness to see the king made it deeply spiritual. And, when they saw the king, who was unlike any other, they worshipped him and offered the most precious of their possessions – gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Dearly beloved, how earnest are we in our pursuit of knowing Christ? Are we deeply committed like the wise men who set aside a considerable part of their lifetime to seek and find the savior? The Savior longs to manifest himself to us. He yearns to have a personal relationship with us. He wants to transform our lives for the best. He wants to light up the dark areas of our lives that need forgiveness, healing and hope. He desires to enlighten us and make us beacons of light who will guide others to God. Jesus said, "Ask, and it will be given; seek, and you will find." The way to ask is through prayer. The way to seek is through daily reading and meditation of the Bible. When we come together for worship on Sundays we ask and seek as a congregation. When we earnestly ask and seek, we can be assured of God's epiphany. I exhort you to take time to ask and seek for an epiphany of Christ. May the Holy Spirit guide you in your pursuit of deeper knowledge and experience of God and of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Please plan to attend our Annual Congregation Meeting on the 13th of February at 12:30 p.m. after the worship service. As part of our seasonal mission, we are collecting donations for 'Livingston Country Heating Fund', 'Gigi's Playhouse Achievement Center', 'Hurricane Disaster Relief' and 'Souper Bowl Sunday'. Your generosity will be a great blessing to those who are in need.

Virtual Annual Meeting February 13, 2022

In keeping with the current session policy of not conducting large gatherings in the church during this phase of the Covid Pandemic, the session has decided to again hold our annual meeting virtually via Zoom.

Recognizing that not all members are able to access a Zoom meeting, a safe location will be set up at the church to allow those members to participate in the meeting.

COVID Guidelines

Due to the sudden spike in Covid numbers, the Session has adopted the following safety plan in line with the safety guidelines provided by the NYS Department of Health:

1. We will continue to worship in-person with all people masked at all times per current NYS guidelines.

2. Holy Communion will be served using prepackaged elements only.

3. We will abstain from physical contact during the Sharing of the Peace.

4. The choir will sing with all participants masked and socially distanced.

5. Coffee hour will be temporarily suspended.

6. Outside groups can use the church facilities with a maximum of 10 participants, and all must be masked.

7. During hymn singing all must wear masks.

8. The collection plates will not be passed during the worship service.

9. The Sunday School will continue with all students and teachers masked.

The Session has adopted these guidelines for one month, and will review at its next meeting.
